Causes:

- Britain's sudden effort to tighten control over the colones and collect more revenue
- Global struggle with France drained the treasury; debt
- No taxation without
 representation

Goals:

- To become an Independent Nation
- To claim equal rights for all citizens and establish a meaningful rule of law
- To create a self governing system
- Although most of the goals were achieved many sacrificed their lives to accomplish them.

The American Revolution



Thesis:

The American Revolution was caused from colonists want to reorganize society and political system, which resulted in equal rights for citizens and their successful separation and independence from Britain.

Consequences:

- No english colonies
- Gained independence and separated from Britain
- Create a self governing political system
- There was more political participation
- End of Mercantilism



Changes:

- Politically there was a much higher participation of people in politics.
 - The elite that had been running the colonies now had to gain the support of the common people.

Historical Thesis:

Although the American
Revolution had many successful
changes such as finding
independence and separation
from Britain, many social statuses
stayed the same such as women's
equality and slavery until almost
140 years later.

Continuities:

- Slavery was not fully abolished till years later.
- Women advocated for equal rights but didn't see any change for about 140 years.
- White men's lives didn't change much either because of their already established power.

MEHAPPY Thesis-

The American revolution was barely a revolution because the government didn't dramatically change afterwards and the social classes didn't see change for years.
