- The American
 Revolution began
 because of oppressive
 rule in England.
- People wanted independence from britain by leaving the monarchy and forming a new nation.
- The Revolution did not result in equality for women, and negatively affected the Native Americans territory. It also brought more slavery.

The American Revolution, lasting from 1775 to 1787 was a result of British oppression and the need for independence from England, eventually leading to a new nation without a monarchy and more freedom.

- Newly joined colonies to create Union

Historical continuities throughout and immediately after the revolution

- Wanted to preserve existing liberties of the colonies rather than create new ones
- Separation from British rule
- All free men enjoy equal liberties unlike elsewhere in Europe.
- Consistent government



- Declaration of Independence written by Thomas
 Jefferson. "We hold these truths to be self-evident,
 that all men are created equal,"
 "A Prince, whose character is thus marked by even.
 - "A Prince, whose character is thus marked by every act which may define a tyrant, is unfit to be the ruler of a free people."
- What is a revolution? According to the American revolution, it would be defined as the overthrow of oppressive rule to ensure liberties.
- The American Revolution was only somewhat truly revolutionary because while it lead to the creation of a new state with values which had been regulated previously by the british and was successful at inspiring other revolutions it still didn't change anything for women or non-white peoples.

E- Jefferson says "For imposing taxes on us without our consent" is part of the long list of reasons for leaving.

- H- The French-Indian war bankrupted the British, leading to increased taxation and more control over the colonists.
