State formation and development demonstrated continuity, innovation, and diversity in various regions.

KC 3.2.I - At the Abbasid Caliphate fragmented, new Islamic political entities emerged, most of which were dominated by Turkic peoples. These states demonstrated continuity, innovation, and diversity.

KC 3.2.I.A - Empires and states in Afro-Eurasia and the Americas demonstrated continuity, innovation, and diversity in the 13th century. This included the Song Dynasty, which utilized traditional methods of Confucianism and an imperial bureaucracy to maintain and justify its rule.

KC 3.2.I.B.i - State formation and development demonstrated continuity, innovation, and diversity, including the new Hindu and Buddhist states that emerged in South and Southeast Asia.
